

## Where can I find the Mpox Vaccine?

In order to receive the Mpox vaccine, you must first meet criteria established by the CDC or your local department of health.

### **Were you exposed to Mpox or do you suspect you were exposed to Mpox?**

If you have a direct exposure to Mpox, or a suspected direct exposure, it is vital to receive a vaccination as quickly as possible.

- Ideally, the vaccine should be received within 4 days post known or suspected exposure for maximum efficacy and protection.
- However, it can be given up to 14 days post exposure.

Since many locations require a referral, it is important to call your health care provider or your local IHS/638, Urban Indian Health Program, or FQHC to immediately get in to see a provider. Mpox vaccines are not offered at all I/T/U locations or all FQHCs, so you may need referred to a facility/clinic that has the vaccine in stock.

### **To help you find clinics/facilities that have the vaccine in stock, you can contact:**

- Your local health department

Additionally, the following I/T/Us and FQHCs have been confirmed to carry the Mpox vaccine, as of the revision date on this document. Please note this list is not fully expansive, and other facilities may carry the vaccine.

Typically appointments can be made to receive a vaccine *only* after a visit with a health care provider occurs. This is to ensure that you meet the criteria for vaccination established by the CDC and the local health departments.

## Central Region

### **Gila River Health Care**

- Must be seen at Gila River Health Care and be identified as meeting the criteria for vaccination.

### **Phoenix Indian Medical Center**

- Requires provider referral; walk in appointments once a referral is made. Typically referrals are made by the provider “on campus” of PIMC

### **San Carlos Apache Tribe Healthcare Corporation**

- Requires provider referral; no walk in appointments
- Call 928-475-1200 (only after you have a referral)

### **Whiteriver IHS Hospital**

- Requires provider referral
- Call 928-338-3683 (Department of Preventative Medicine)

## Northern Region

### **Hopi Health Care Center**

- Requires provider referral; no walk in appointments
- Call (928) 737-6000

### **Supai Health Station**

- They **do not** carry the Mpox vaccine, but can request it from Peach Springs.
- Requires referral; no walk in's

### **Tuba City Regional Health Care**

- Monday through Friday 8 am to 5 pm
- Call 1-866-976-5941 for advanced scheduling
- Patients can also be seen through the same day clinic on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of the outpatient primary care center (OPCC Building)

### **Winslow Indian Health Care Center**

- Requires provider referral; no walk in appointments
- Call 928-289-4646 (only after you have a referral) and ask for the appointment desk
